BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The FY09 budget increase is primarily due to a contribution to Operation Hope for \$25,000 and the recognition of pass-through incremental lodging taxes associated with the Lewistown CDA to the Greater Richmond Convention Center in the amount of \$61,000.

In addition, the FY09 budget includes a one-time donation to the Hanover Arts and Activities Center for \$5,000 and a one-time donation to the Town of Ashland for \$5,000.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

- Continue to honor regional and local funding agreements that recognize the County's share of participation.

Community Support

2007 Celebration – Promotes the 400 year celebration of Jamestown.

American Red Cross – Provides transportation to approximately 300 individuals in Hanover to medical appointments.

Arts and Cultural Funding Consortium – Consolidates and provides funding for the arts and cultural organizations in the Richmond metropolitan area. Many of the arts organizations work in Hanover schools and Hanover citizens constitute over 20% of the Consortium's member organization's free and paid performances and programs. Direct benefits to the County include operational support for the Montpelier Arts and Education Center and Barksdale Theatre, Richmond Symphony performances at Randolph-Macon College, Theatre IV performances in the County, and Virginia Opera and Virginia Historical Society participation in Hanover Schools.

Barksdale Theatre – Barksdale Theatre at Hanover Tavern opened with its first production in January of 2006. These funds help sponsor the Theatre's expansion back to Hanover Tavern.

Beaverdam Heritage Days – Nonprofit organization founded in 1996 for the purpose of broadening our understanding of the history, culture and contributions of various groups in the founding of the Town of Beaverdam.

Capital Area Training Consortium – Provides job training and employment assistance services to laid-off workers, as well as economically disadvantaged persons.

Central Virginia Health Planning Agency – Plans for medical services and facilities, collects and disseminates health care data, and provides health care education.

Council on Aging – Provides services for the senior population including a health fair, health screenings, and health counseling.

Governor's School – Each locality participating in the Governor's School supports the facility based on the number of students attending from the respective locality. These funds represent Hanover's share each year until fiscal year 2009.

Greater Richmond Convention Center Authority – The Authority is funded through the lodging tax generated in each participating locality. The amount appropriated totals 100% of this tax in Hanover.

Greater Works Community Development Corp – Operates The Pharmacy Connection (TPC), which is a program to help uninsured persons obtain prescriptions for chronic medications.

Hanover Adult Center – Provides care for adults of all ages with special needs.

Hanover Arts & Activities Center - The center is a 148-year old facility located in Ashland. The organizational goal of this non-profit is to provide opportunities for cultural enrichment, educational ventures, and personal growth for area citizens. This is a one time contribution for technology equipment.

Hanover Habitat for Humanity – Building and selling affordable homes in Hanover County. This contribution offsets the associated fees and utility connection for two houses.

Hanover Historic Preservation Fund – These funds are provided on a matching basis to preserve the historic sites in the County. The FY07 appropriation is the final installment of a \$200,000 pledge to the Hanover Tavern. These funds are now administered with the Planning Department budget.

Community Support

Hanover Safe Place (Hanover Domestic Violence Task Force, Inc.) – Provides financial counseling and legal services for victims, training programs, prevention programs, and batterers counseling groups.

Hanover Tavern Foundation – The Foundation is renovating the tavern for public use, including daytime use as a learning and teaching center for area children.

Heritage and History of Hanover County – This one-time funding will be used to provide assistance to Heritage and History of Hanover County, Inc. in the form of the purchase of a Hanover County history book written by Mr. Priddy.

Historic Polegreen Church Foundation – Provides educational programs based on the theme of the Polegreen Church site and the struggle for religious freedom.

Homeward – Regional homeless services coordinating organization for Hanover, Richmond, Henrico, and Chesterfield.

Irvin Gammon Craig Health Center - Located at St. Joseph's Villa, the Center provides healthcare to low income and underserved individuals regardless of their ability to pay.

J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College – Hanover pays approximately 14% of the College's operating and capital costs. Capital costs (\$66,800 in FY07 for Hanover) support projects such as exterior signage and lighting improvements, campus entry improvements for vehicles and pedestrians, congregation areas, safety improvements, and landscape redesign and refurbishment. Other contributors are the Counties of Goochland, Henrico, Louisa, Powhatan, and the City of Richmond.

Jamestown 4 H Center – The Center provides camping, environmental education, and leadership training to youth and adult volunteers.

Leadership Metro Richmond – This contribution is to offset the costs of the training provided to Hanover employees.

Maymont Foundation – Hanover funds the Foundation along with the Counties of Chesterfield and Henrico, and the City of Richmond. These funds allow Maymont to maintain the present service levels, expand upon the educational programs, and upgrade the park's maintenance. The Nature Center at Maymont is a state of the art educational center where the ecology of Richmond and the surrounding areas can be understood through innovative programming and teaching techniques.

Meals on Wheels – Provides hot meals to homebound residents.

Montpelier Center for Arts & Education – The Center, located in Western Hanover County, is committed to providing educational opportunities and encouraging participation in the arts and creative expression for all ages.

Operation Hope – Operation Hope is a citizen organized and led project to create, fund, and build two identical all-access playgrounds at Pole Green and Poor Farm Parks.

Parsons' Cause Foundation – Produce a living history presentation of Patrick Henry's famous case known as "The Parsons' Cause".

Read Center – The Center will work with 25 County residents to improve their literacy skills.

Community Support

Regional Taxicab Program – Implements programs and improves services for taxicab customers.

Richmond Metropolitan Convention and Visitors Bureau - The Bureau is designed to promote the metropolitan Richmond area (including Hanover) as an attractive vacation spot, convention place, and motion picture filming location. Specifically for Hanover, this includes promotional inducement with Kings Dominion, familiarization tours of horse racing farms, Scotchtown, battlefields, shuttle service from County hotels to Richmond conventions, radio station advertising highlighting Hanover attractions, and coordinating all feature films, commercial production, and television shooting in Hanover.

Richmond Regional Planning District Commission – Represents the Counties of Hanover, Charles City, Chesterfield, Goochland, Henrico, New Kent, Powhatan, the Town of Ashland, and the City of Richmond. Funding is based on \$.60 per capita.

Richmond Sportsbackers – Promotes sporting events in the Richmond area.

Ride Finders – Serves Hanover as the region’s ridesharing agency.

Science Museum of Virginia – Provides educational exhibits focusing on the sciences.

Scotchtown – The birthplace of Patrick Henry provides tours and special events for the public.

Senior Connections - A planning and coordination agency for people age sixty and older living in Planning District 15 (includes Hanover) under the jurisdiction of the Older Americans Act of 1965. The agency serves 150 people in the County. The contribution is based upon \$1.05 for every person sixty years of age or older. There are currently 14,759 such residents in Hanover.

St. Joseph’s Villa – Provides temporary housing and support to families who have lost their homes.

Town of Ashland – This one time fund supports the 150th Anniversary Celebration of the town.

VCU Children’s Medical Center – Funds to support the pediatric oncology program at VCU Children’s Medical Center.

VCU School of Engineering – These funds recognize the important impact of the School to the Richmond metropolitan area and support the School’s growth and success.

Virginians for High Speed Rail – Nonprofit organization established to bring high speed rail access to Virginia.

Western Hanover Committee for the Aging – Provides nourishing meals, programs, and companionship for senior citizens in Western Hanover County.

NOTE: The Parks and Recreation budget contains funding for The Parks and Recreational Advisory Committee. The Committee distributes those funds to organizations in Hanover County. The Planning Department budget contains funding for the Historical Commission which oversees preservation grants. Also, the Economic Development budget contains the County’s regional contribution to the Greater Richmond Partnership, which is the economic development organization for the Richmond Metropolitan area.
