### **New information has been developed in an unusual residential break-in case.**

The Hanover County Sheriff's Office was contacted by the Henrico Division of Police late this afternoon in regard to three trash bags full of opened gifts and other various items that were recovered in their County today. These items were discovered by a citizen in an alleyway in the 2300 block of Bailey Drive in Henrico's East End. Henrico Police responded to the scene and recovered the items, which have since been turned over to the Hanover Sheriff's Office. After examining these items, it was determined that they were the same as those reported stolen in the Verdi Lane break-in.

Also this afternoon, the Hanover Sheriff's Office was contacted by the Jacksonville, North Carolina Police Department in regard to Sheridan Marlow, who was originally listed as one of the three remaining suspects wanted in connection with this case. Jacksonville P.D. indicated that they arrested Marlow in their jurisdiction, who is currently incarcerated in the Onslow County Jail in North Carolina until an extradition hearing can be arranged at a later date.

The Sheriff's Office is encouraged by these recent developments and will remain committed to apprehending the two remaining suspects in this case so as to bring it to a quick conclusion. Below is an updated list of each suspect's status in light of these events:

- Suspect #1: Jacob Amsden  
18 years old, White, Male, 5'4", 125 pounds, Blue Eyes, Blonde Hair  
Status: WANTED
  
- Suspect #2: Oscar Aquino  
19 years old, Hispanic, Male, 5'6", 155 pounds, Brown Eyes, Brown Hair  
Status: WANTED
  
- Suspect #3: Sheridan Marlow  
19 years old, White, Male, 5'6", 160 pounds, Brown Eyes, Black Hair  
Status: **ARRESTED**
  
- Suspect #4: Daniel Ice  
18 years old, White, Male, 5'11", 165 pounds, Blue Eyes, Red Hair  
Status: **ARRESTED**
