Investigators David Wright and Patrick Lamb were assigned a domestic homicide that occurred on September 4, 2004, in which Kelvin Hargrove was arrested for the death of Doris Hargrove. Although numerous Investigators assisted in this case at the time of the incident, Investigators Wright and Lamb were lead investigators from the initial call for service until the prosecution. Investigators Wright and Lamb met with the Commonwealth Attorney's Office on many occasions and spent over twenty man-hours preparing this case for trial. On May 25, 2005, this case was presented to a jury in a two-day trial. Investigator Lamb was asked over a hundred questions by the prosecutor and defense attorneys. Investigator Wright testified to the statement of the suspect. The suspect, Kelvin Hargrove, was convicted of first-degree murder and the jury recommended he receive thirty-five years in jail.

Both investigators were professional, thorough and practiced excellent law enforcement skills as they carried this case for over a year. The Commonwealth's Attorneys Office complimented both officers for their initial response, their thorough collection of evidence, their assistance and patience in working with their office, their tedious preparation for trial and attributes, which led to a successful prosecution.

Investigator Patrick Lamb and Investigator David Wright are awarded the honor as ***CO-OFFICERS OF THE MONTH FOR MAY 2005***. Patrick has been with the Sheriff's Office since June 2001 and was initially assigned to the Uniform Patrol Division. Upon his transfer to General Investigations in 2002, he is our primary Forensic Investigator and AFIS Terminal Manager. David Wright returned to the Sheriff's Office in June 1999 and has been a General Investigator since October 2003.
