

The Hanover County Sheriff's Office has arrested three suspects for the vandalisms that occurred at Hanover High School and Oak Knoll Middle School on October 3, 2007.

During the early morning hours of October 3, 2007, a Hanover Sheriff's Deputy was conducting a regular check of Hanover High School and Oak Knoll Middle School located on Route 301 when he discovered that both buildings had been vandalized with spray paint. The vandalism was primarily confined to the rear of each building and contained offensive words and symbols. As other officers arrived on the scene and assisted with a search of the area, it was further discovered that other outbuildings had been vandalized with spray paint. Additionally, the Hanover High School football field was also found to have been vandalized by the suspect(s) through the use of an ATV that was already on-site, which belongs to the school. The damage is estimated to be well into the thousands of dollars, making it a felony offense.

Subsequent investigation of these vandalisms with the cooperation of the Hanover County Public Schools and the community has resulted in the arrest of two adults and one juvenile. Each suspect is a current or former student of Hanover High School, and has been charged with one count of Vandalism (Felony) and one count of Trespassing on School Property (Misdemeanor).

- 1. Cyle Moore** – 18 years old of the 10200 block of Old Lansdown Road in Mechanicsville.



- 2. Chase Scott** – 19 years old of the 7100 block of Cold Harbor Road in Mechanicsville.



- 3. Juvenile** – 15 years old.
